The EconLit records include complete bibliographic citations, subject descriptors and subject codes from the AEA's 1961–1968 classification system, geographic and regional descriptors, and named historical persons.

EconLit will soon add records for articles from the 1886–1968 collective works (edited volumes, conference proceedings, etc.). The American Economic Association will also match abstracts from the *Journal of Economic Abstracts* (1963–1968) and from the *Journal of Economic Literature* (1969–1986) to journal records.

The older records will become part of EconLit subscriptions at no extra cost.


